From the Pastor

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Advent is a season of waiting and preparation, a time for Christians to reflect upon the birth and second coming of Jesus Christ. Each month we gather together to receive the amazing and mysterious blessing of Holy Communion. The table is the Lord's and every person is welcome – saint and sinner, young and old, believer and those struggling with their faith. There is a place for everyone!

Unfortunately, not everyone can gather around the table. Some of us are no longer able to attend church. As the Church of Jesus Christ, we must ensure that everyone is included in the sacrament, that everyone is being nourished. We are seeking volunteers who would be willing to carry Holy Communion at least 2-3 times a year to those who cannot attend church. You would be given the elements after the service. Some time on Communion Sunday, you would carry the elements to 1 or 2 members.

You would determine when you are available to carry Holy Communion. It is hoped that everyone would receive Holy Communion quarterly. A brief

training session to clarify your responsibility will be held in January. (It will be offered both in the afternoon and evening to accommodate your schedule.)

Please pray about this opportunity to be of service. If you are being called to this ministry, please let the Church Office know. We will start this ministry on February 2, 2020.

We want to ensure that there is a place for everyone at the table, even if the table is in their kitchen.

THE HOLY SPIRIT - WITH US AND AT WORK

I know I could write something about Advent but instead let me share some thought about the Holy Spirit (by Richard Rohr).

The often forgotten third person of the Trinity – the Holy Spirit – I love the Holy Spirit and what she is up to. I can tell you that I call on her presence every day to be moving in and around me, Grove Ave. UMC and the Moxham community.

The Holy Spirit has been sent to the entire universe and since creation has been transforming [the universe], carrying it toward the final resurrection... think about that... She is actively at work not only helping us create the Kingdom now but to bring it to its coming!!! I don't know about you, but I find that pretty exciting. This same Spirit continues to renew us and ALL of humanity, AND all nations, NOT by imposing uniformity but by diversity. Hear that? It's not about being alike but about all of creation living out of its special uniqueness. Again, very cool stuff, don't you think?

Here's another thing - God is still creating.... Have you ever thought about that? All of history has been the age of the Holy Spirit; the universe is still expanding. Have you ever thought about that? GOD IS STILL AT WORK. And I don't know about you, but I find that EXTREMELY comforting as well as hopeful.

But we/the world pushes back, don't we? In spite of advances in consciousness, science, technology, and awareness, horrible wars and unbelievable injustices still happen, both personal and systemic oppression continues.

Alas, the good thing is, the Holy Spirit never gives up on us. Scripture's arc reveals the salvation of history and ALL of creation. God's divine covenants are with the people collectively — past, present and future. Individuals like Abraham and Moses and Mary as instruments and mediators... and us too.

Think about this – that each of us is caught up in this history, almost in spite of ourselves: Why? How? Are you and me part of this? Because YAHWEH shows mercy to Israel and their descendants forever. We are included also those decedents. God does not leave us; God does not break covenant no matter how many times we do.

Consider this: the Spirit is like a homing device put inside of us. For all of our ignorance and mistakes, there is in everything this deep, internal dignity convinced of its own value. This divine indwelling keeps insisting, "I am what I am seeking!" (meditate on this)

- It's God in you that loves God.
- It's God through you that recognizes God elsewhere.
- It's God for you that assures you that you are finally and forever okay.

To me, this is so affirming – God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit – living me seeking out more of what we are. I hope you think of God living in you, that you are part of the Holy, that you are part of the Kingdom that is and is yet to come... that's who we are as adopted children. Believe, believe in your goodness, your influence, God's presence in you to make a difference in someone's life and in the world – Christ lives in you. Celebrate it, share it, challenge the world where Jesus is not and be Christ's presence by merely being yourself. You are the gift to the world this season and every season – let your light shine, let the light of Christ in you shine. The world needs you. And it is all now, not just in the past and not just to come. COME, O HOLY SPIRIT, COME!!!

The flamingos have gone to a warmer climate for the winter. \$415 was collected for the General Fund this year. Thanks for supporting this fundraiser. – Donna Bako


Gift Card Fundraiser
